

**First International Symposium on Concurrency, Real-Time, and Distribution in
Eiffel-like Languages**

Information for Delegates

Registration and Accommodation

The symposium will begin at 0930 on Tuesday 4 July 2006. Registration will be from 0845 at the King's Manor.

You will need to arrange your own accommodation for the symposium. There is a limited amount of accommodation available on campus, but since the meeting is taking place at King's Manor, in the city center, you may choose to stay closer to the meeting venue.

You may prefer to stay in the city center closer to the King's Manor. York has a wealth of B&Bs and hotels (the former generally being cheaper). A good place to start for finding accommodation is the York Tourist Office's room check:

which will let you search for B&Bs, guest houses, and hotels.

The nearest hotels to the King's Manor are:

Any hotel or B&B in the city center (ie., within the city walls) is within easy walking distance of the King's Manor (maximum 15 minutes).

Conference Venue

There will be signs in the main entrance of the Manor directing you to the conference room. All sessions, coffee and tea breaks, lunches, and the banquet, will be held in the Manor.

The King's Manor is approximately 10 minutes walk from the York Rail Station.

Airports

The nearest airport to York is Leeds/Bradford International Airport. There is no direct rail service from this airport – you must take a bus from the airport to Leeds Central Station (approximately 40 minutes), and then a train from Leeds to York (about 30 minutes).

Alternatively the International Airport at Manchester, although further away, has better rail service direct from the airport to York. It takes approximately 1.5 hours and a saver ticket costs around £26.

To travel to York from London Heathrow or Gatwick, you must first make your way into the center of London, to King's Cross train station. Either take the Tube (Picadilly Line, direct to King's Cross, approximately 1 hour and £4.50), or take the Heathrow Express to Paddington, and then the Tube (Circle/District Line) to King's Cross.

Rail

York is well serviced from London (Kings Cross Station) and all other parts of the country. It is on the East Coast Main Line. See <http://www.nationalrail.co.uk> for train times and prices. If you are travelling from Manchester or Leeds, you need not book your train tickets in advance: you can buy a reasonably priced saver ticket on the day of travel. If you are travelling from London or Edinburgh it is to your advantage to buy a ticket in advance, and to specify your times of travel. You can buy tickets through the National Rail site given above, or direct from the East Coast main line operator, GNER: <http://www.gner.co.uk>. You can arrange to pick your tickets up at a station (eg., King's Cross).

Car Parking

York is a medieval city and thus parking is limited. There is **no** pay-and-display parking at King's Manor. There is public parking nearby on Marygate. Alternatively, you can park at the university and take the number 4 bus in to the city center (£1.50 single). Car parking is available at any of the University's Pay and Display car parks (subject to availability). See map for location of these <http://www.york.ac.uk/np/maps/>. Car Parking costs are:

£1.00 for 5 hours

£2.00 for 8 hours

£3.00 for 24 hours

Refreshments/Lunches
